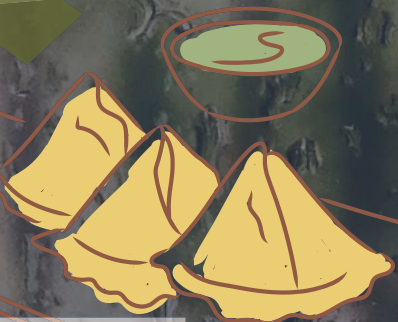

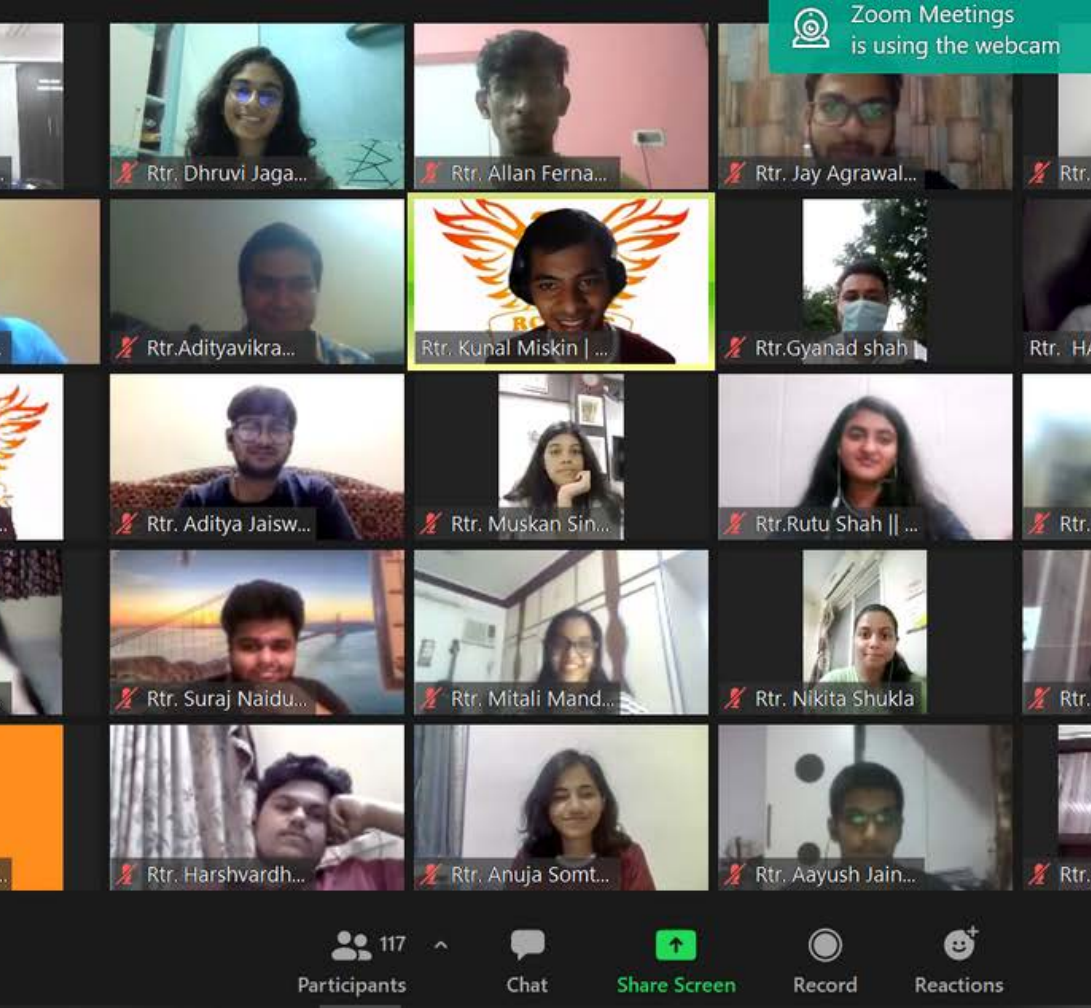

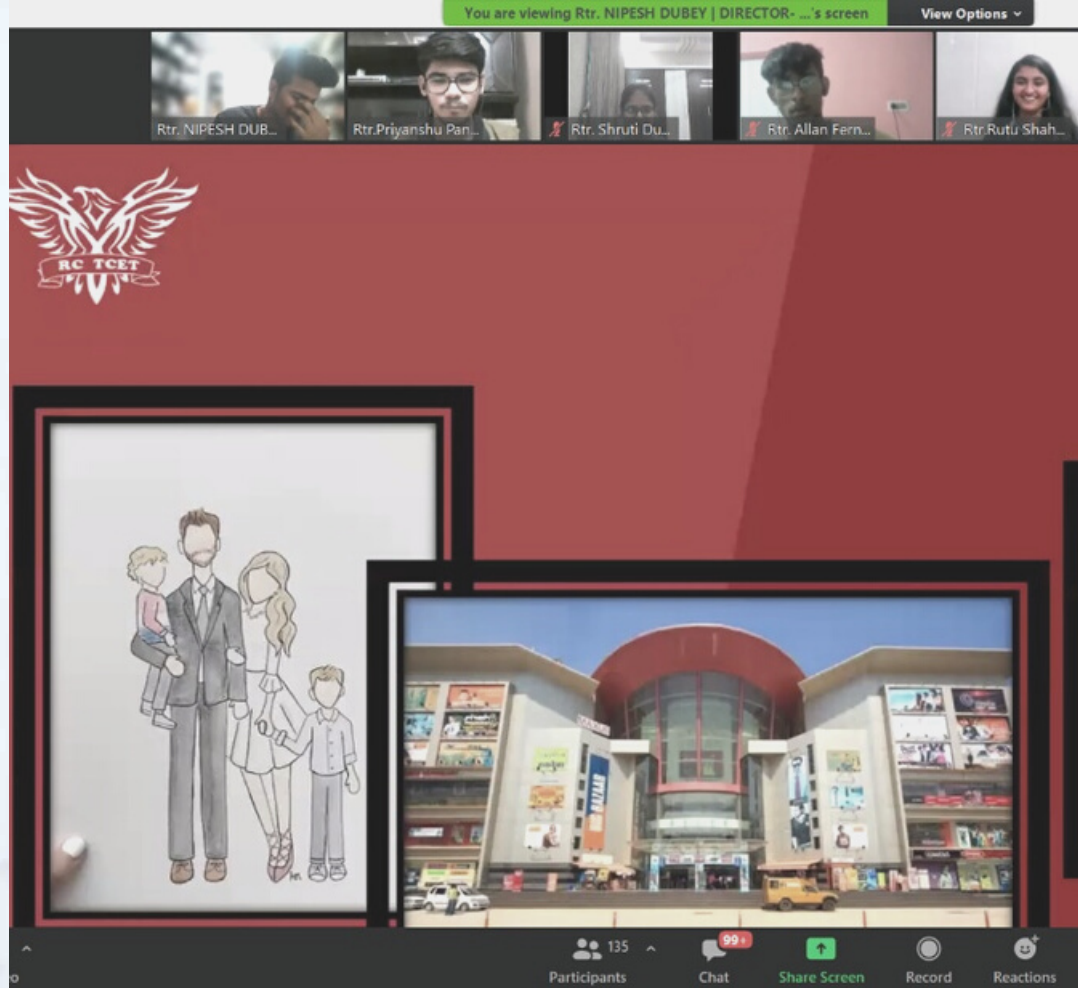

BONDING ACTIVITY-1

Bonding in the club is the process of creating a team that is cohesively working together towards a common goal. The importance and main purpose of bonding activities is to create a strong team through forming bonds and connections. This bond is what makes the entire year enjoyable for all members of the club. Creating these bonds through games is very beneficial for any organization. The first bonding activity is very essential for the club as this is the first time the members get to bond with each other and get to know each other.

Bonding Activity 1 was conducted on 3rd July 2021 under Club Service Avenue. The main aim of this activity was to encourage online gaming and increase the bonding of members. The activity was conducted by Club Service and Sports Director, Rtr. Nipesh Dubey.

The game had a total of 3 rounds in it. The first round was “Guess the movie name” in which participants had to guess the movie by looking at the image. The second round was “Guess the movie by the song.” As the name suggests, in this round members had to guess the movie by lyrics and guess the song by image. The lyrics were either in English or in different languages compared to the original song’s lyrics and for the image round, emojis and images were used to frame the song name/lyrics by which the members had to answer the name of the movie.

In the end a bonus round was also there where the host translated the actual name of the movie into different languages, said it out loud and the members had to guess the movie.

INK THE SHRINK

"Real problem is not population explosion, but what the population is doing."

Today, there are 7.8 billion people in the world, and India ranks second in row, just behind China with 1.38 billion people. Typical projections of population growth predict that Earth will be in a state of human overpopulation by 2050 or sooner. Each person has a genuine right to a sufficient and equitable share of Earth's resources. With our population approaching 8 billion people, even if everyone accepted a low standard of living, the planet would still be pushed to its ecological breaking point. Unfortunately, the 'typical individual' on Earth consumes at a rate that is more than 50% more than what is sustainable.

Hence, on the occasion of World Population Day that is on 11th of July, the very first editorial activity was conducted. Ink the Shrink was a slogan writing competition, organised by the Editorial Service Director of the club, Rtr. Malcolm Cardoza. The activity was launched on 6th of July.

In this activity members were asked to write 2 line slogans or phrases on 'Overpopulation' in any language of their choice. The Rotaract Club of TCET aimed to spread awareness about overpopulation through this activity among our society and members. Riveting write ups were uploaded by our members, and the number of responses were remarkable. There were a total of 45 overwhelming entries for this event.

From all the responses, top 5 slogans were to be selected and posted on the club's social media handles. As planned prior, winners of Ink the Shrink were declared on 11th July, 2021 followed by their slogans posted on our Instagram page. The winners were Rtr. Vandita Gopal, Rtr. Nandini Yadav, Rtr. Tanishq Suryawanshi, Rtr. Ambresh Shukla & Rtr. Shubham Sarvankar.

Overpopulation and overconsumption underlie most of environmental problem we face today. It is our duty as citizens and responsible rotaractors to help in whatever way we can. This activity was one such way of giving back to our community and spreading awareness.





PROJECT SAHAYTA



Rotaract has always believed that every human has the right to grow up in a clean and safe environment. People who have access to clean water, basic toilets, and excellent hygienic habits not only thrive, but also have a healthier start in life, away from the risk of many diseases. Despite COVID-19 putting the spotlight on the importance of hand hygiene to prevent the spread of disease, many people in our country and worldwide do not have access to a clean toilet let alone a hand washing facility. People living in rural areas, urban slums, disaster-prone areas are the most vulnerable and the most affected because of this issue.

The story of this activity begins when Nazareth Foundation, a local NGO, requested our club for assistance in making septic tanks in the Dharavali village of Madh that would help provide the villagers with cleaner and more hygienic toilets. Our club availed of this golden opportunity to address the cause of access to clean toilets for everyone. Thus our Project Sahayta was conceived as a project aimed to build a toilet septic system that would benefit the local community. But before we could

commence, a survey of the community and the condition of the current toilets had to be undertaken. The results of the survey showed that there were next to no arrangements for public toilets in the village. Hence it was decided to initiate the process immediately. The septic tanks for the toilets were built under the AICTE: SPICES Scheme, a scheme aimed to provide financial assistance to institutions which in turn form clubs to ensure developments of students. A local civil contractor was called in to decide the material requirements of the tanks and to finalise the construction process. As soon as the materials were delivered the construction work for the tanks began. This project lasted in total for 6 days i.e. beginning from 4th July. At the end of the 6th day, our club had successfully built 3 septic tanks for toilets for the local community.

Through our project we were able to facilitate almost 100 villagers to their basic rights to clean water and hygienic toilets. Overall this endeavour was a thumping success for our club which resulted in the betterment of a community.





WORLD POPULATION DAY 11 JULY

WORLD POPULATION DAY

The pace at which the population is growing is a matter of concern and is one of the biggest issues on this earth for humanity and the environment. It is really important for us to bring more attention to these population woes. It has become even more important during the Covid-19 pandemic as it has deeply affected our health systems.

So, we at RCTCET did our part and tried to create awareness amongst youngsters regarding this matter on the occasion of World population Day celebrated on 11th of July. Our International Service Avenue accomplished this by organizing sex education seminars and conducting a 3 day social media awareness campaign. Through this campaign the club ensured that the young club members understand the significance of World Population Day. The first day was aimed to increase people's knowledge about

various issues like Women Empowerment, Exercising the choices, Quality education for all etc. and how these issues are associated with the population. The Pros and Cons of overpopulation were discussed and covered in the 2nd day of the awareness campaign, various statistics regarding this topic were also used to convey the points to our members. The 3rd day of the campaign was aimed at increasing peoples understanding and changing their perception regarding sex education, and also discuss its importance and how it can help the world in proper family planning which would result in population control. The club also organized various fun activities such as slogan making which helped convey the message of World Population Day.

Through this initiative the club's aim to promote the message of 'A little less makes a lot of difference' was successful.



UNAGI- SELF DEFENSE WORKSHOP

Definitely, the main highlight of this episode was of Ross Geller trying to explain the art of Unagi to the girls despite being a total schmuck at it! The other subtle highlight of this story was a very important concept i.e. self-defense which is very much needed in today's life.

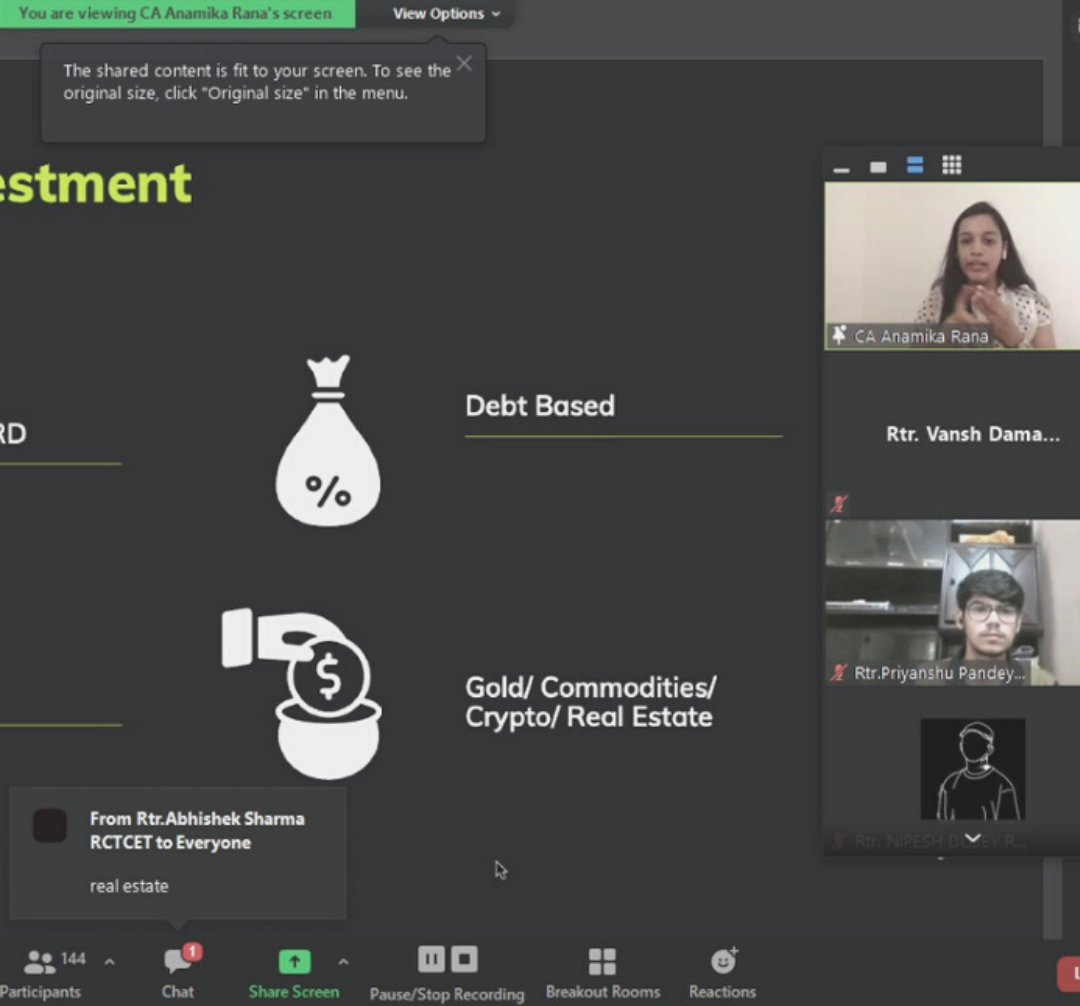
We, at RCTCET, understand why it is critical for everyone to know how to defend and protect themselves in the event of an emergency. Following up on that thought, the club held a self-defense training with Mr. Anil Patil, the President of the Karate Do Association of IJKA National and International Referees. He began the lecture by explaining to our club members what self-defense is, why it is important, and how it benefits them in a variety of ways. He explained that one of the many important benefits of attending self-defense training is how you feel afterwards. Many people are unsure of their ability to defend themselves before joining a practice. Fighting is nearly impossible without balance. You will become more alert of your surroundings after taking self-defense classes.

Karate, like many other martial arts, is built on the foundations of trust and respect. It instils mutual respect as well as self-respect.

Following that, we also learned fundamental karate self-defense methods such as choke against the wall, straight punch defence, knee strike, groin kick, and wrist defence, among others. He demonstrated manoeuvres like side kick to jaw, side kick to heart which may result in the attacker being unable to breathe for several minutes & can also lead to fatality, and knee drop to heart in real time and taught us how to predict the opponents' next moves. He told us that the only way to master these movements is to practise them. Later in the lesson, we talked about how to defend ourselves in various situations.

The session concluded successfully after two hours. The feedback received from the students was extremely positive as this was a much needed lesson, especially for women. On that note, we intend to conduct many such useful seminars even more often for our club members.





INVEST EARLY, INVEST RIGHT

Investing is allocating money towards assets in the hope of making your future better. Investments are made with the view of earning returns, which grows your amount invested to a higher sum. When it comes to the world of investing, most people don't know where to start. So with an objective to educate youngsters about the various methods of investment, Rotaract Club of Bombay NorthWest Malad in collaboration with Rotaract Club of TCET, Rotaract Club of Bombay West, & Rotaract Club of RJ College came up with a webinar called “Invest Early, Invest Right”.

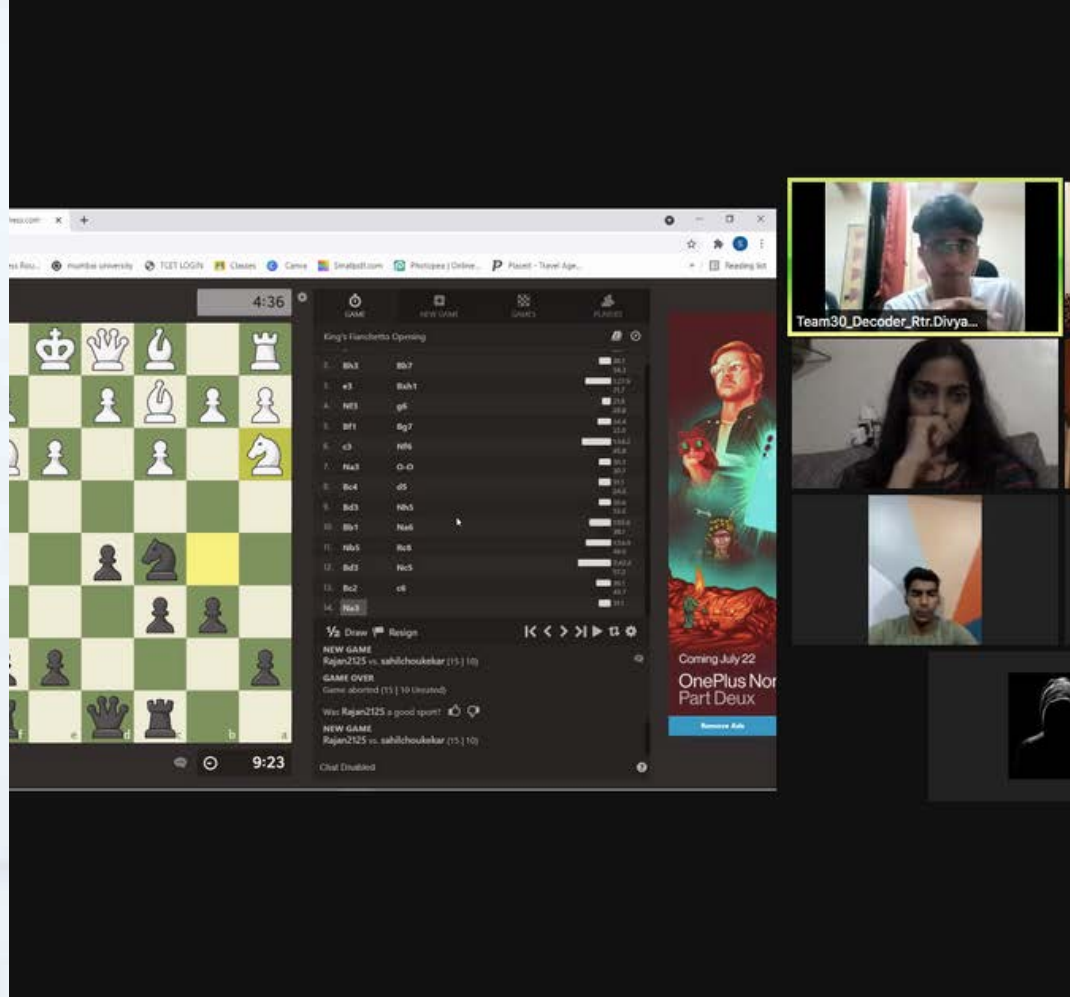

An overwhelming total of 62 entries were received from 35 participants. The event concluded on the note:

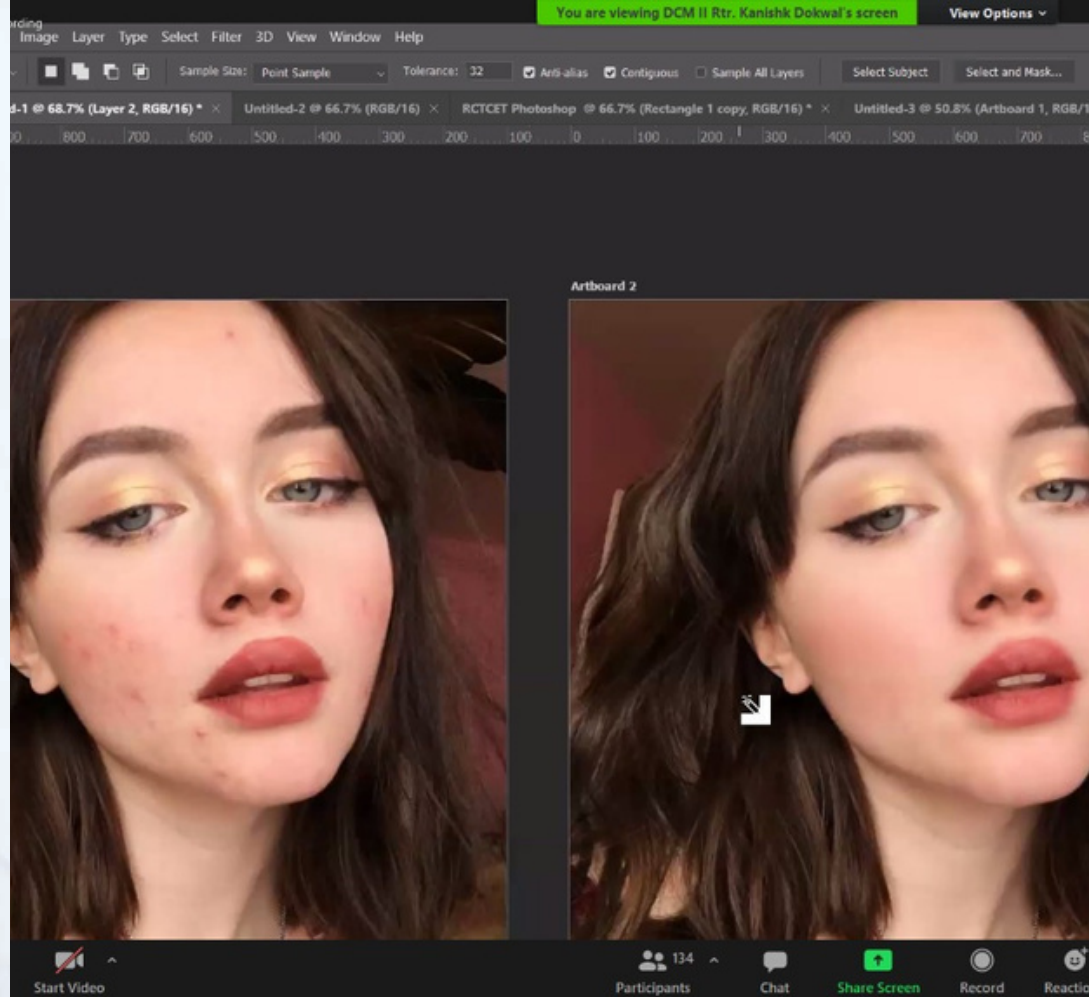
Memes are the best way to address the social values of the society through humor.

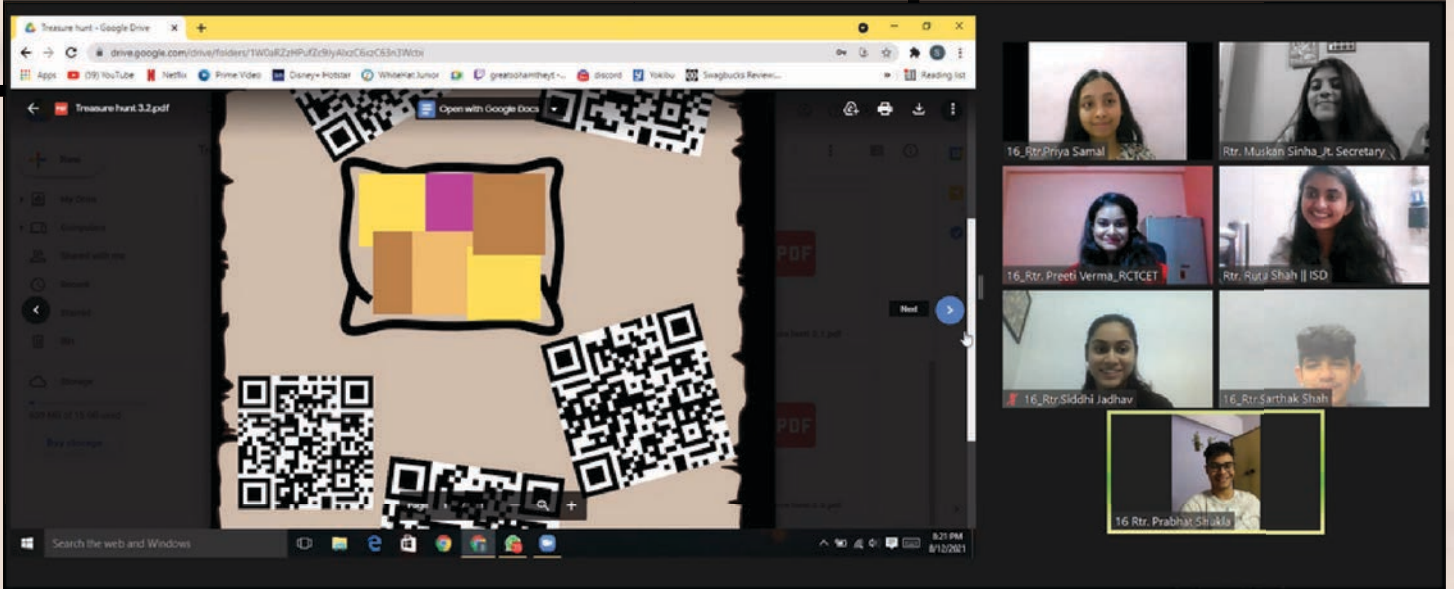

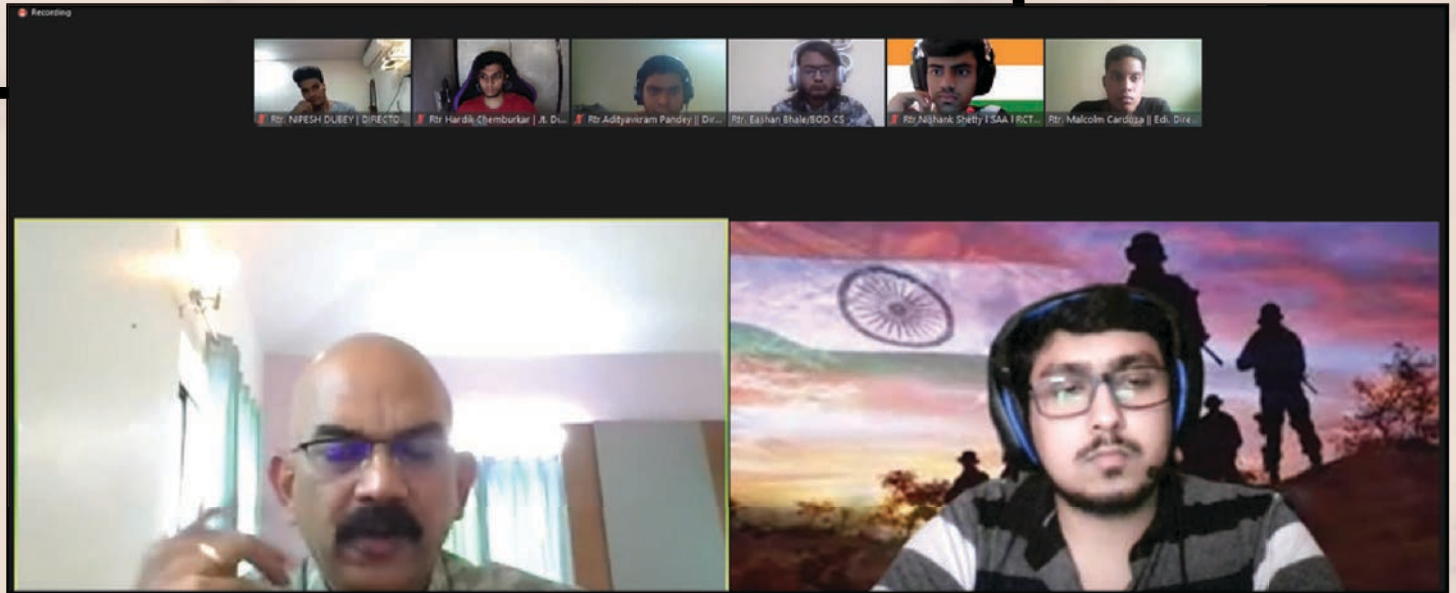
As Nelson Mandela once said, “Education is the most powerful tool to change the world.”

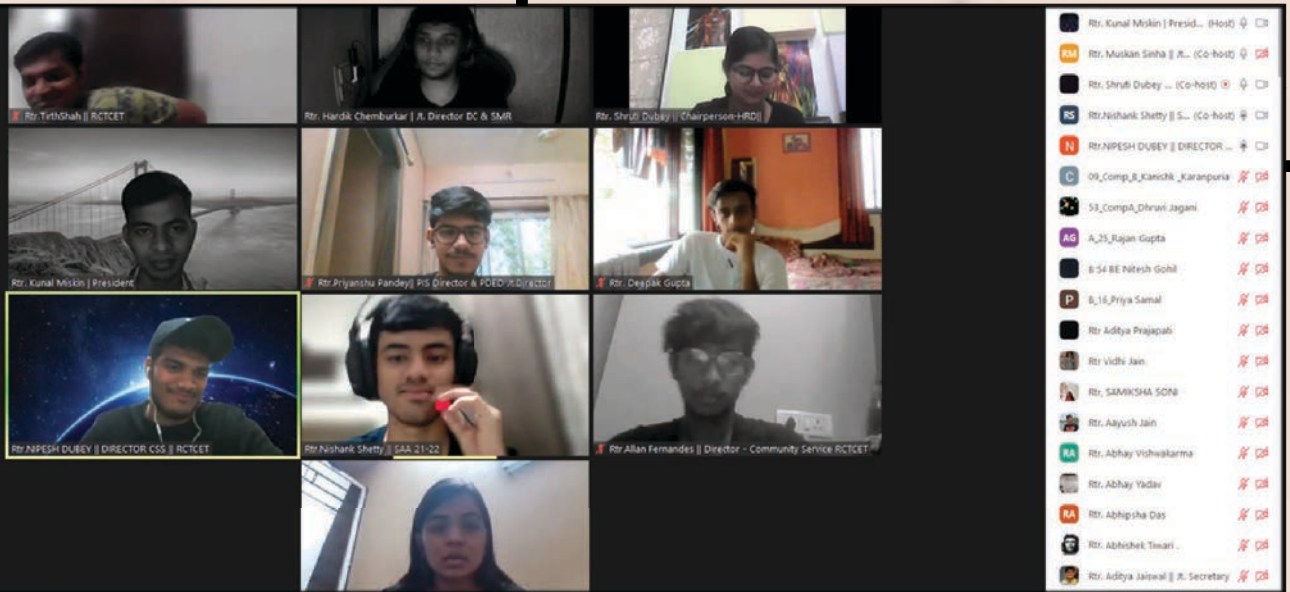

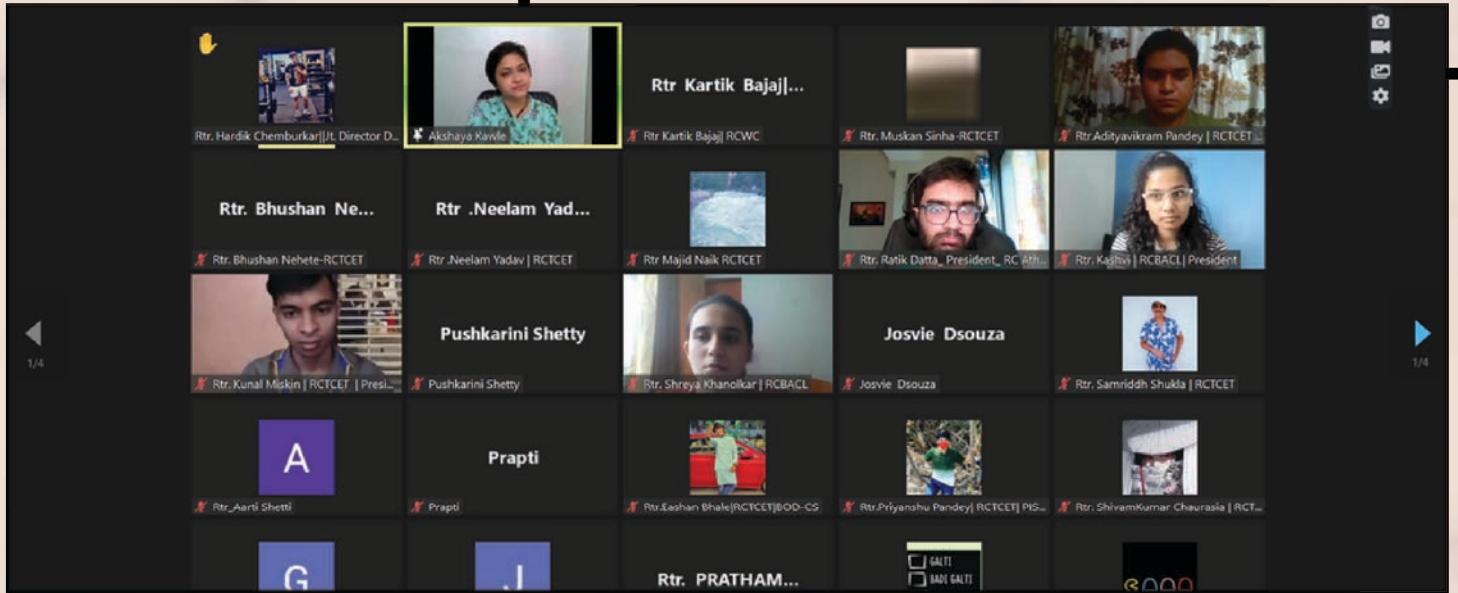

MASK DONATION



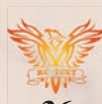

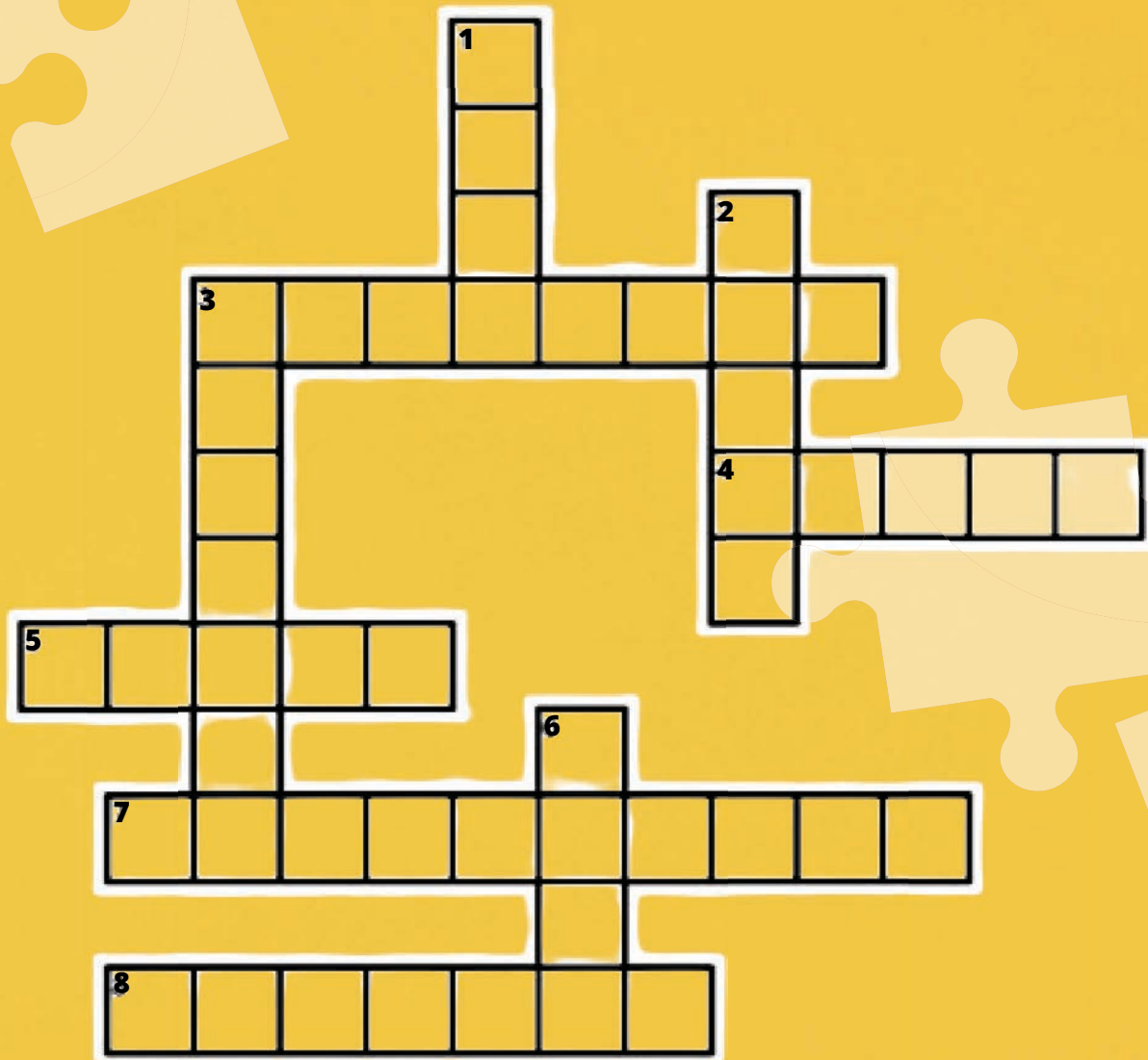

Multiple activities in the span of 10 days were held to share the festive joy of Ganesh Chaturthi. These activities

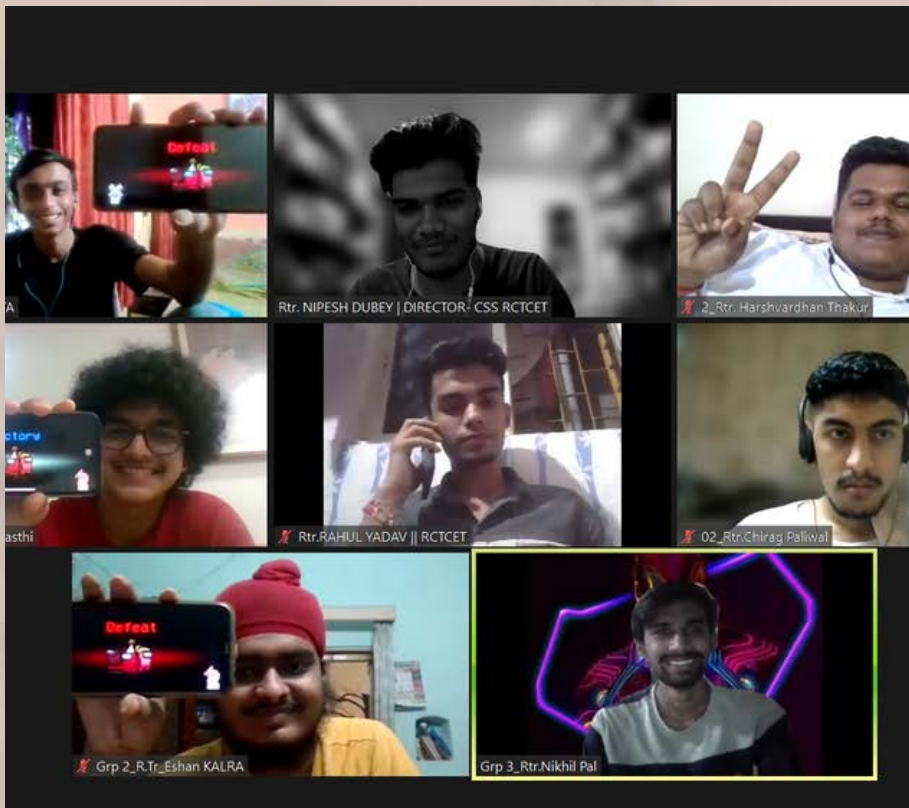

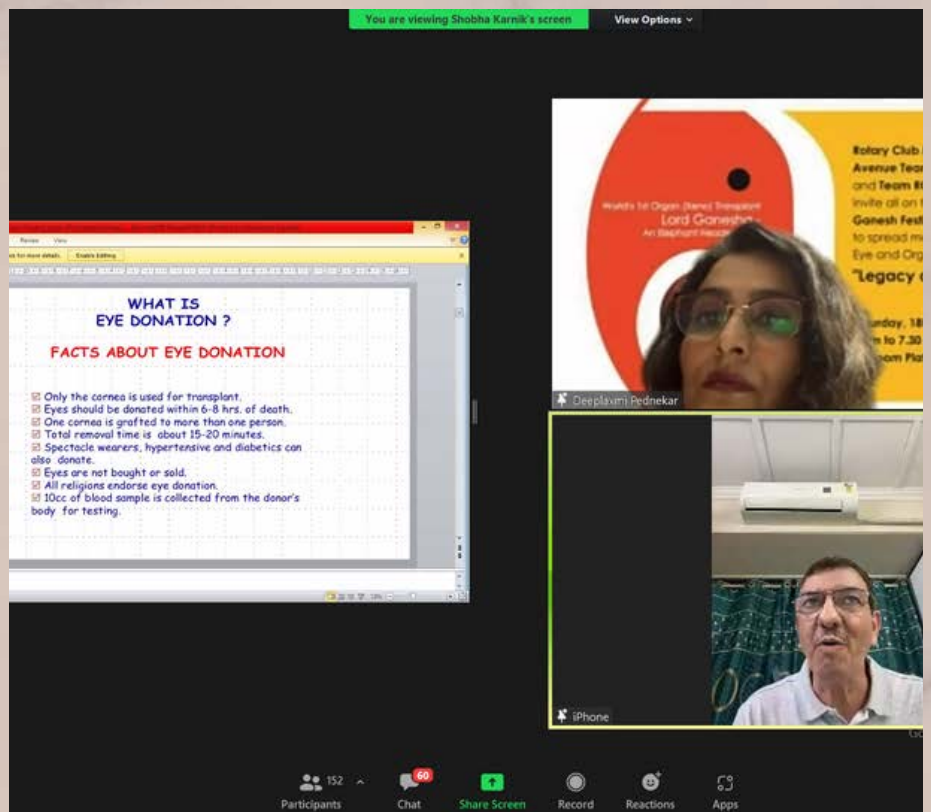
Thus, the main motive of this event was achieved as this event was filled with lots of laughter, smiles, some casual fooling around, and most importantly the feeling of bonding was achieved.

Similarly, more than 50 thousand people need a liver, out of which only 4 thousand people get it in time. Many people die due to non availability of organs for transplant, so it is very important to bring awareness among people about organ donation.

There were also a few proud organ donors present in the seminar, who expressed their heartfelt gratitude after the donation.

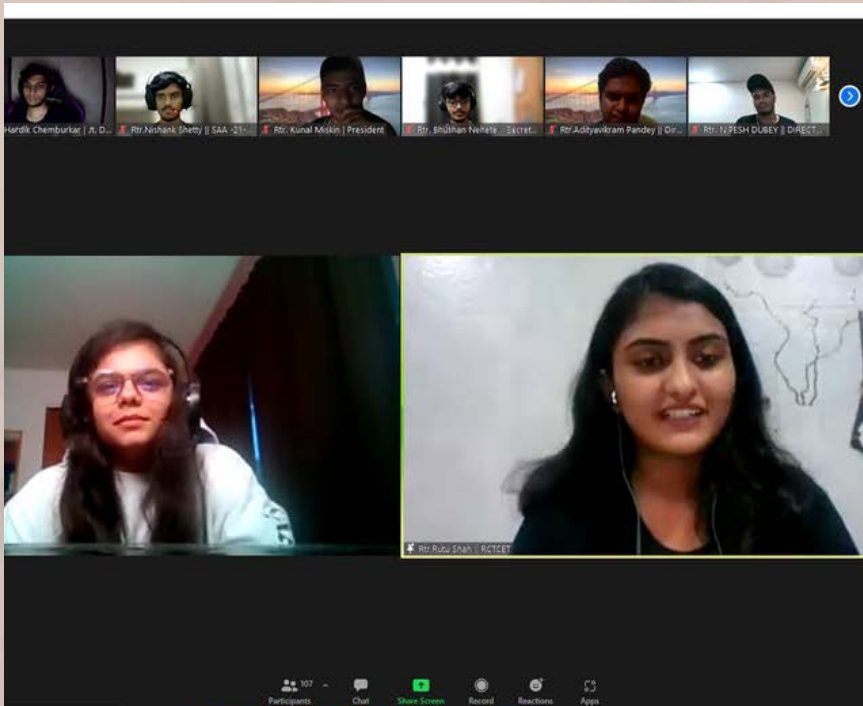

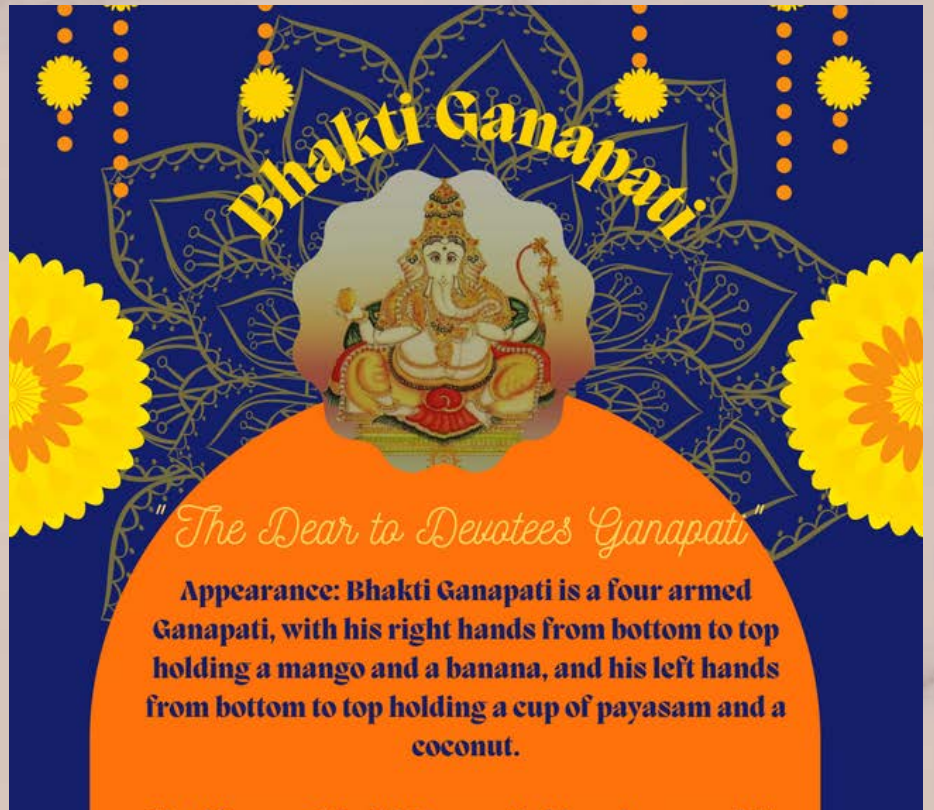
GANPATI DARSHAN

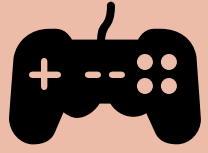
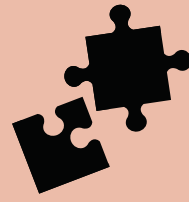
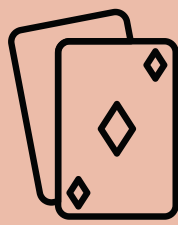


For 11 days, overall information along with the appropriate pictures of at least 3 forms of Lord Ganesha got posted on the stories.

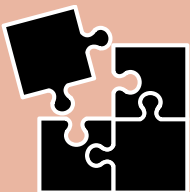

"Someone's sitting in the shade today because someone planted a tree a long time ago."

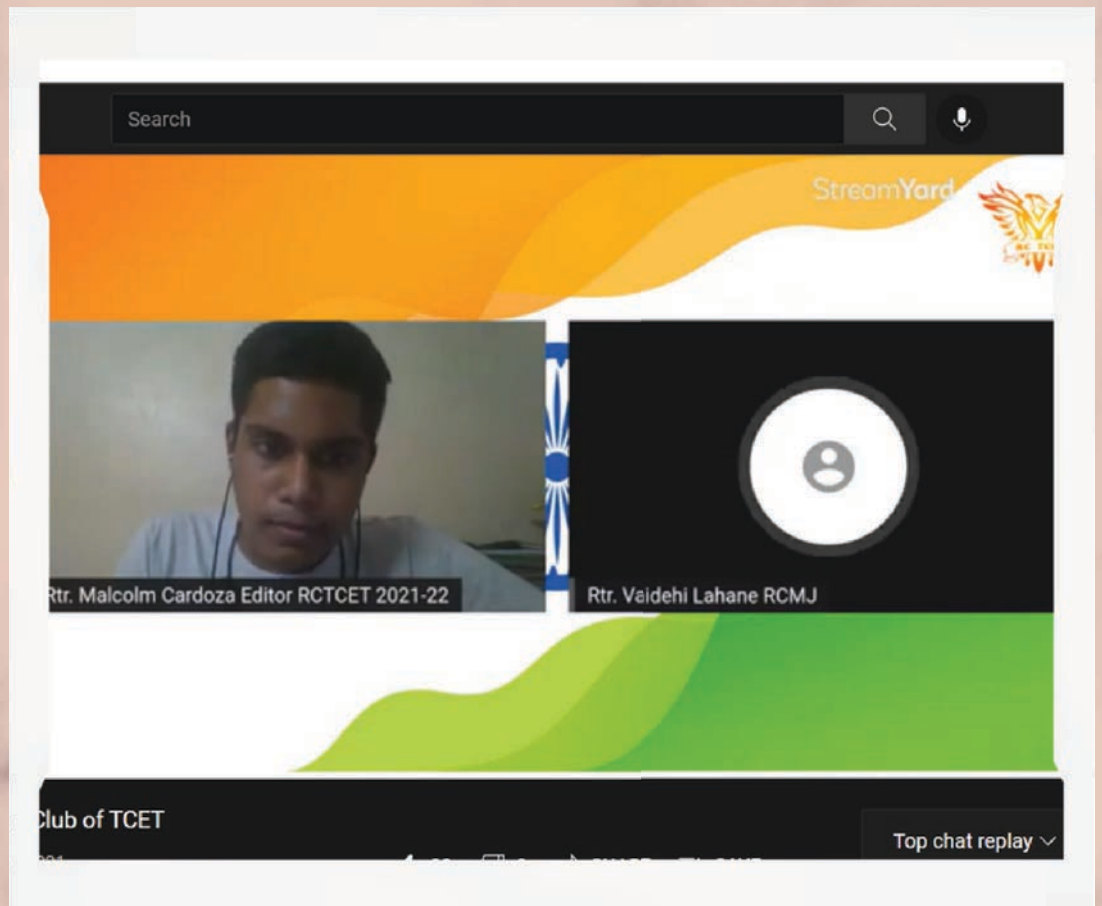

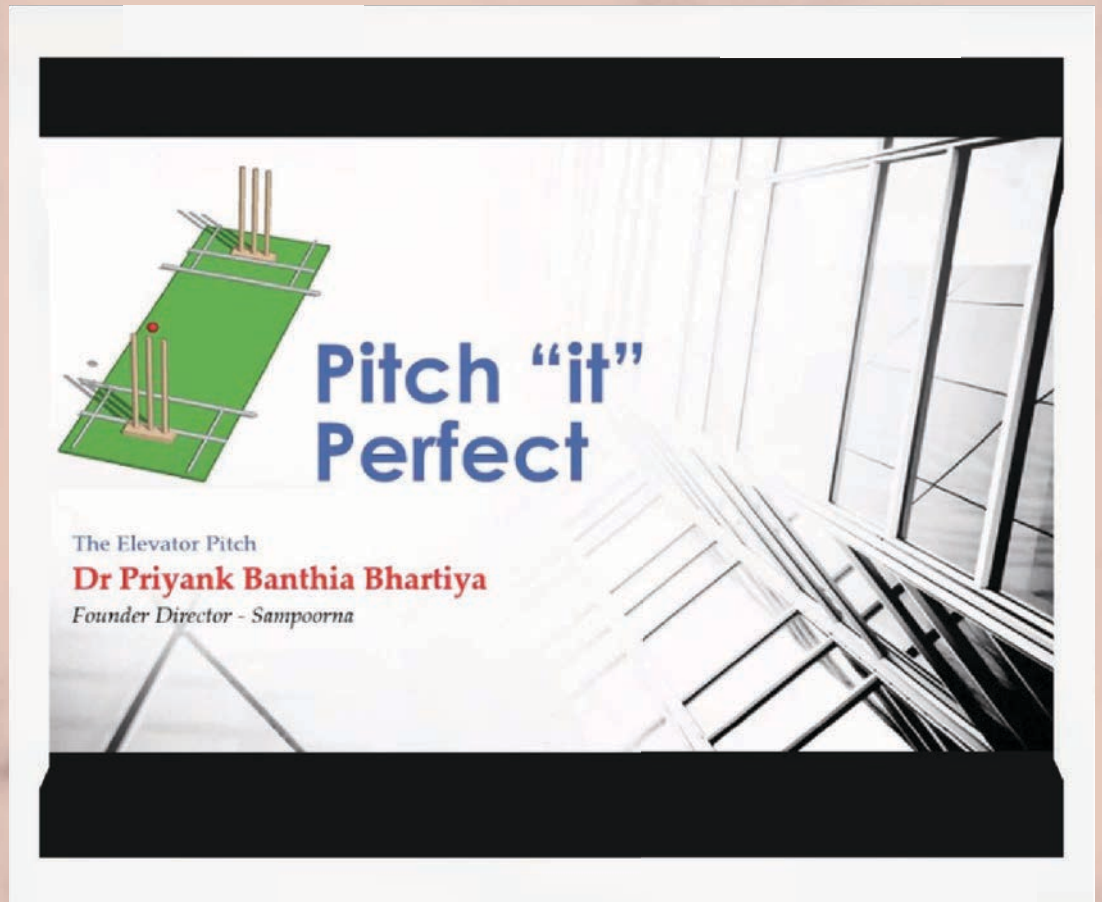
Celebrating this historic day, on 8th October 2021, International Service and Social Media Avenue of

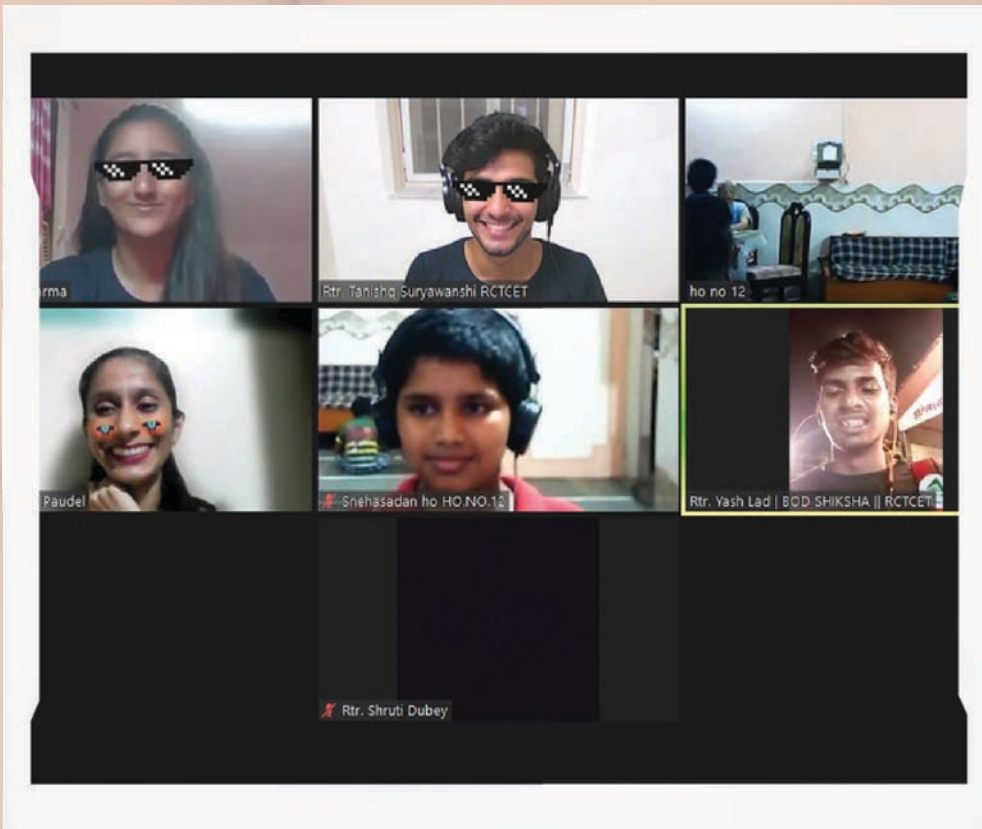

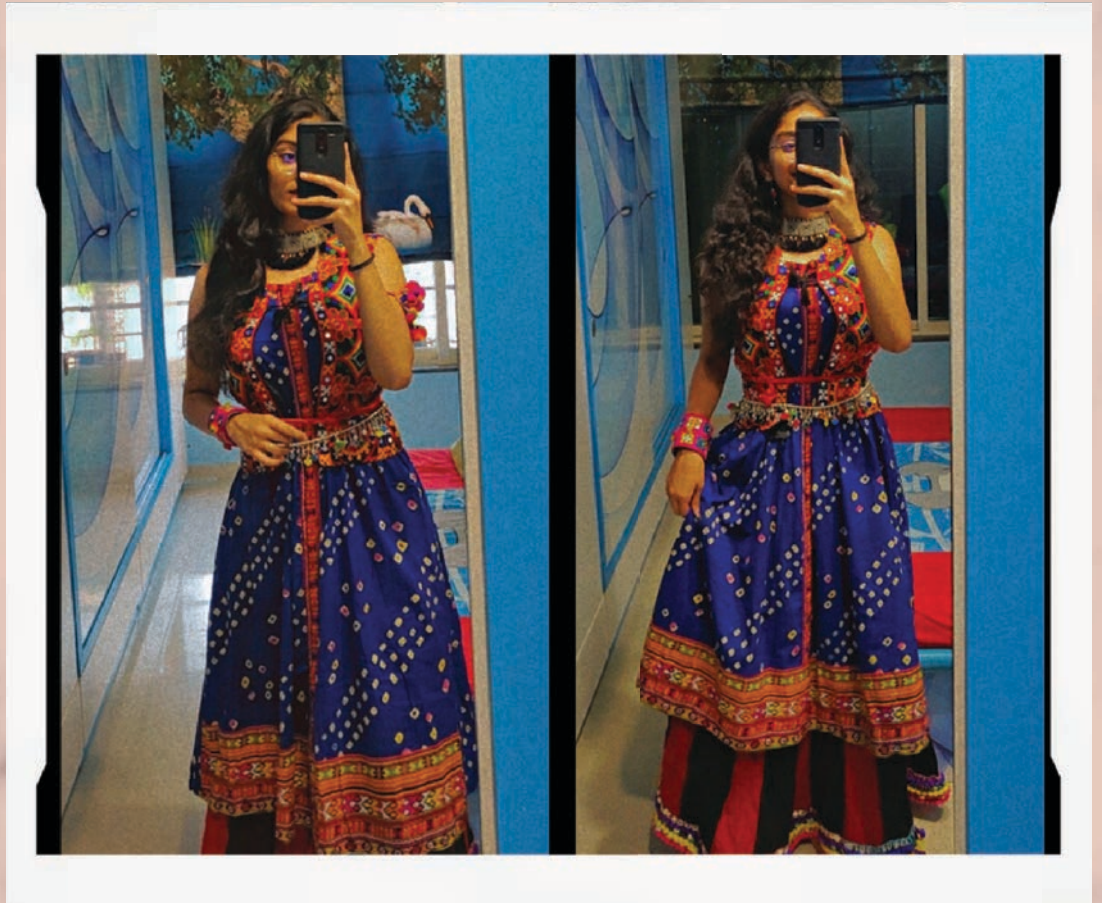

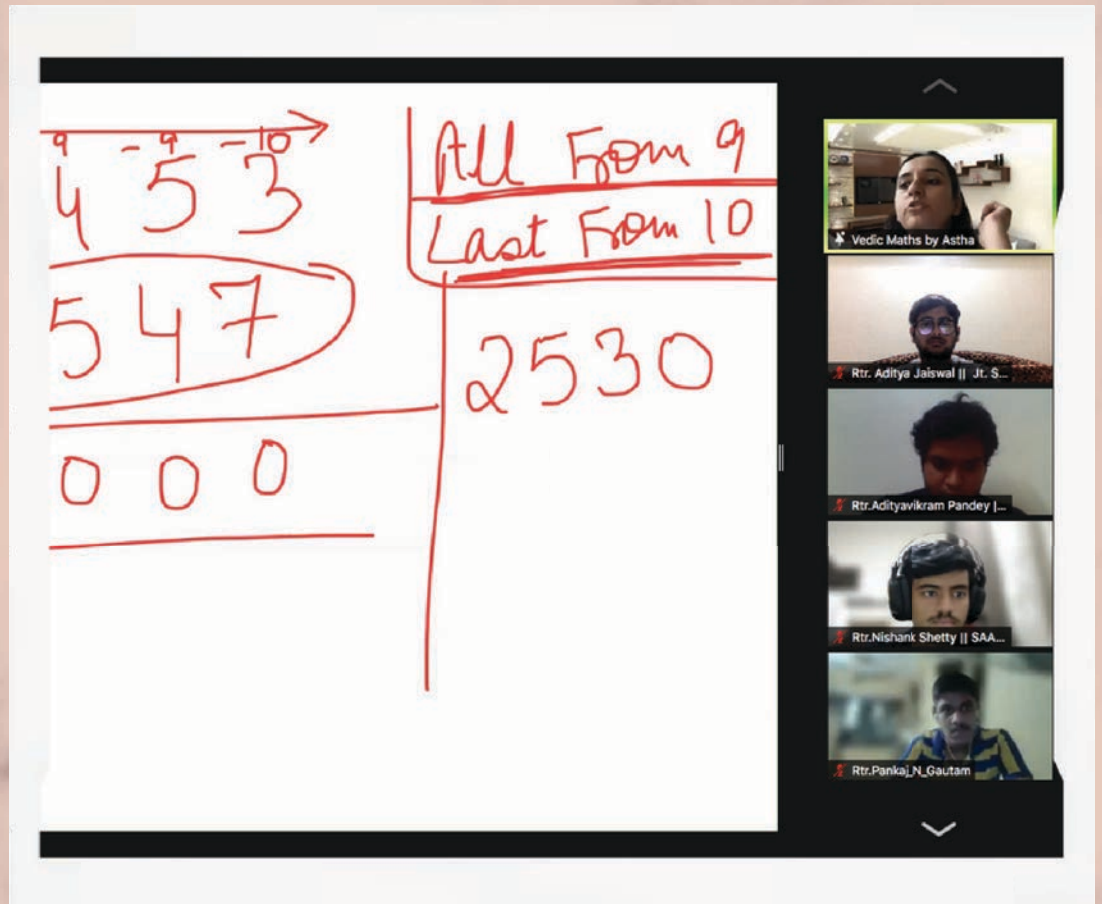
